



# DOG OR CAT CERTIFICATE OF SALE



Any person selling a dog or cat must provide the following information to a new owner/purchaser.  
Breeders/sellers should keep a copy for their own records.

List any control orders in place.

## ATTENTION NEW OWNER

### YOU MUST REGISTER YOUR DOG OR CAT NOW

Do it yourself, it's easy! If you don't have internet/an email address, contact your council for assistance.  
All dogs and cats must be registered (even if your council doesn't charge a cat registration fee) it's the law!

Go to [www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au](http://www.dogsandcatsonline.com.au)

1. Select **Register**
2. Select **register my new animal**
3. Enter **Microchip number**, **Desexing ID** or **Transfer code** and your **Surname**.  
If you haven't been given these details, select **Unknown**
4. Check if you have an account—if so, select it and proceed without logging in, or  
continue as a new owner
5. Ensure your details are correct
6. Complete registration

Log in at any time to update your contact details. This will help you reunite with your dog or cat if it goes missing. You can choose 'LOST' from the 'STATUS' drop down menu on your dog/cat's record in Dogs and Cats Online (you can also add your contact details to be displayed to the public). If your dog or cat goes to a new home, you must transfer its registration to the new owner in Dogs and Cats Online. You will receive a transfer code. Provide this to the new owner—they need it to register the dog/cat into their name via Dogs and Cats Online.
