Rosetta Harbor view side
No accessible car park but can view whales from any car park available. Sealed path down to the heritage trail.

Petrel Cove 1
Accessible car park available, but obstructed view. Can view whales from the car in other parking bays.



3

Petrel Cove 2
Accessible car park available. Can view whales from car. Compact gravel path out to the point right of the car park with a bench seat available at the end.

Granite Island
Head across the causeway either by horse drawn tram or getting yourself across to Granite Island. Can view whales from the path at the rear of café. Accessible toilet available at the café.

Encounter Bikeway
An alternative view of Encounter Bay Sanctuary Zone is at the top of the hill about 150m up the Encounter Bikeway. Stop at the bench seat available to view the whales.

Bashams Beach platform
No accessible car park available but other car parks might be suitable (can get busy). Platform with information signs. There are 5 steps to access the platform. Compact gravel and sand path to reach the platform. A pit toilet is available however it is not accessible. This spot overlooks the Encounter Bay Sanctuary Zone.

Port Elliot – Freeman Lookout
No accessible car park available however numerous car park spaces are available. Whales can be viewed from a few of the car parks. Paved path out to look out with 180 degree views.

Surfers Parade car park corner of Miami Blvd
While there are car parks along Middleton Beach this car park is up high making it easier to view whales. It is a compact gravel car park with no marked out car parks.

TIPS: Take your own binoculars, check the whale centre logged sightings, check the accessible toilet website (<https://toiletmap.gov.au/>), and check the accessible car parks by using the BlueBays App on your phone. Accessible toilets are available in the townships of Middleton, Port Elliot and Victor Harbor.

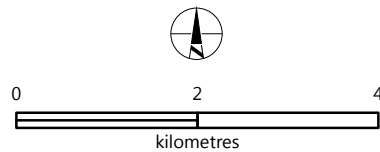
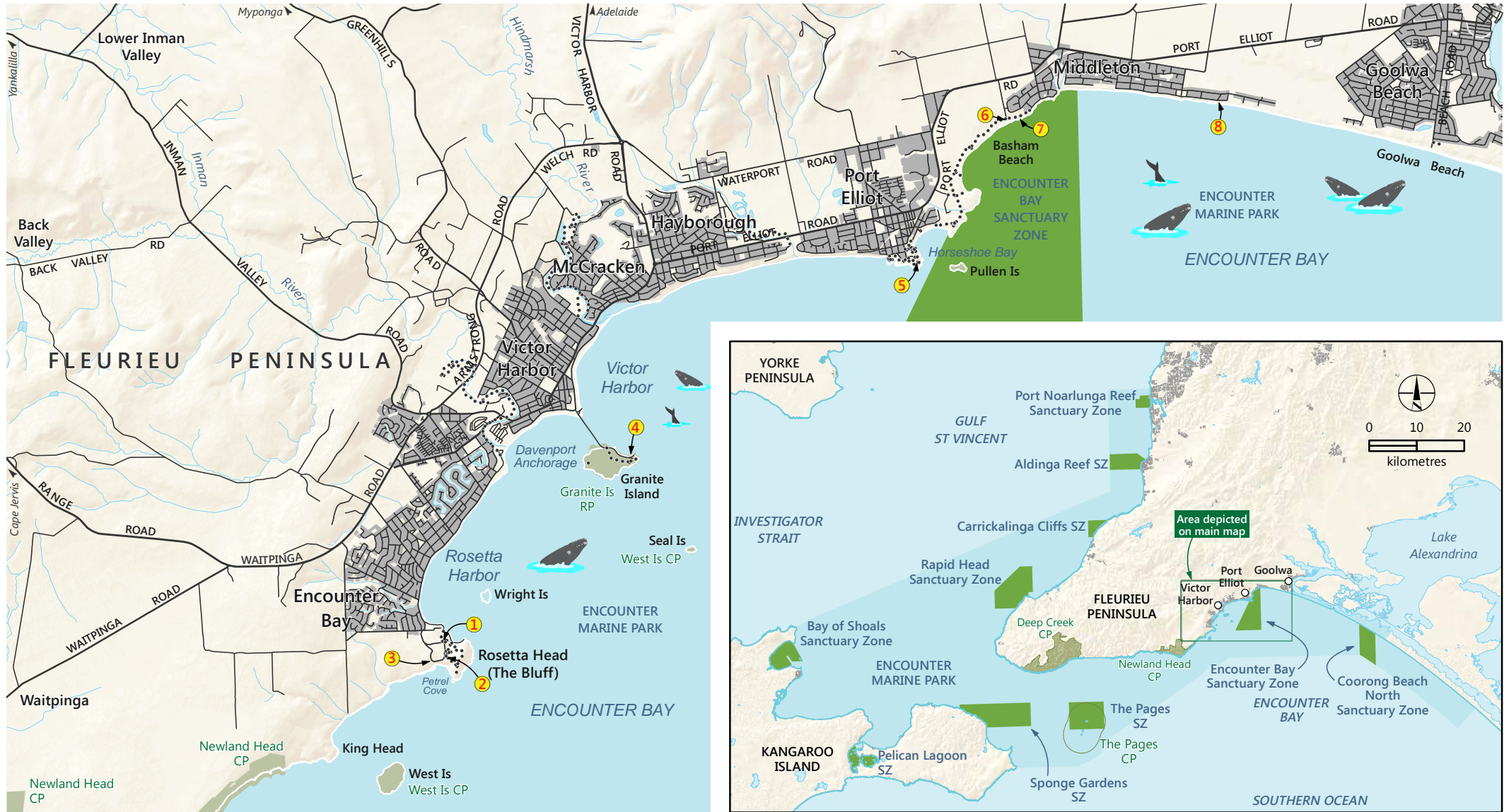
